War II while being in the Army's 41st Infantry Regiment in North Africa. "I guess I'm just one of the lucky ones. I went in December of 1942 and got out in November of 1945."



When mentioning the purpose of the Senior Moment column. "All I know is that I've been here for 94 years," Edgar joked last week in a packed living room of family and

friends after the presentation. "There was a lot of mud on the roads where I lived. They were dirt roads. There was a man with one horse who had a one horse 'Jagger,' wagon. I don't know why they call them that. They would go down to the gravel pit with a horse and wagon and get gravel for the mud holes. You couldn't put much on with one horse. The Strahorns in Fair Hill had two wagons."

Foxhunting was a big thing in the area, but foxes are not legally allowed to be captured. "We used to get up on the hill and watch the fox while the dogs were running them."

"Pleasant Hill Store (Blue Ball Road) was there since we came up from down south (Edgar was six weeks old) in 1921. Robert Scarborough had it. You could get coffee, salt, sugar, flour. They sold gas and kerosene. Kerosene used to be called coal oil. A pump to pump motor oil. There was another store across the road. Henderson Store."

As the price of gas dipped lower than we have seen in years, go up and has slightly plummeted again, Edgar remembers when a gallon was mere cents. "Charles Brown Store (East High Street in Elkton) would always sell six gallons of gas for a dollar and on Sundays, it would be seven gallons for a dollar."

In his day, the phrases, simpler times and good old days were not all that easy. "I went to Pleasant Hill School (two rooms) and I rode the bus a couple of years in Elkton. I quit school at 16. Pop said, 'if you're going to quit school, you're going to work.' He made me plow starting with a 20 acre field. It was a two horse plow that was 16 inches (wide). I would have to go out into the woods and cut wood. Pop made me take care of the horses before dinner and I had to milk (cows). We didn't have electric till the 1940's."

"I was 18 when I worked at Child's Papermill. It was Marley Mill then it was Elk Paper."

At one time, Blue Ball Road was connected with Landing Lane. "There was a bridge on Blue Ball Road. It went across the tracks."

"We'd get our work done. A man asked me, how much do you think a boy would be worth cutting corn? I didn't know he was talking about me. I said about three and a half cents a shock or two dollars a day. I cut about 40 shocks. I went out after dinner and shocked 50 more. He said that was three dollars and sixty five cents. He couldn't believe it. They said they could finish the rest. DuPonts gave me seventeen and a half cents a shock."

"We had a relative on Lums Road. He had a nice holstein bull. Earl and I walked that bull all the way to Pleasant Hill for mating and back. We went through the back roads and did that twice."

"There was a big snowstorm in the 30's. There was two crews that started shoveling on Blue Ball Road (where Mendenhall's Store is) and one in Fair Hill. Wherever the wind drifted, it was higher. The machines couldn't push it. The banks at Lewsville were 12 feet high. We shoveled by hand and met near where Wesley's is. I think there was six of us in each crew. I was 14 years old I guess. Us boys got 15 cents an hour. The men got 18 cents an hour."

As the old saying goes, "work never hurt anybody." "I agree with it,"

Edgar said. "I always tried to do more. If he can do it, I can do more. That's how we looked at things at the old paper mill. You have to prove yourself. My father put me in the woods and the barn. I worked hard all of my life and now I'm not worth a nickel."
