increasing.

Last week, the Council was critical of a multi-million dollar initiative to begin the process of updating the county's emergency communications system.

They also discussed cuts to the Animal Control budget, which would not affect the contract with A Buddy For Life, which runs out at the end of the calendar year. If the cut is approved, it would diminish the animal control budget for the second half of FY16.

Both last week and this week, the Council expressed concern over the detention center's two supervisors - one who operates the regular detention center and the other, former Sheriff Barry Janney, who is now running the community corrections portion of the jail. The Council wondered if both of these positions are needed. The Council members are also thinking about cutting nearly \$90,000 that is being requested by the Sheriff for riot gear.

another \$249,000 they agreed could probably be cut from the budget. These proposed cuts included:

-Nearly \$30,000 in legal fees

-\$30,000 in professional services for the Information Technology department, cutting their request for a new system for the permits & inspection department's permitting software program and analysis to just over \$60,000

-A \$15,000 request to sealcoat the parking lot at the county courthouse was nixed.

-\$31,000 of the Department of Public Work's contracted services were cut, leaving them with \$282,000. DPW also lost \$20,000 from their equipment and maintenance budget.

-The Roads Administration of the DPW lost \$25,000 from the trash removal/recycling program at the landfill. They usually contract people to police the grounds at the facility.

-\$10,000 of the \$88,000 earmarked to create new signs and replace road signs was cut.

-A portion of the radio parts budget was cut for Emergency Services.

-Emergency Services has a budget of \$466,000 for overtime in next year's budget and the Council decided to cut \$66,000 from this area of the budget.

In order to place an expenditure in the County Executive's budget on the chopping block, the proposed cut had to be supported by three County Council members. Until the Council takes their final vote on the budget in June, the items cut during the work sessions could be reinstated and/or more cuts can be approved.

The Cecil County Council will return to their budget deliberations during next Tuesday mornings Council Work Session.
