Restoration of the Jacob Tome Gas House

Prospective bidders are hereby invited to bid on a General Contract for the restoration of and modifications to the Jacob Tome Gas House located in Marina Park in the Town of Port Deposit, Cecil County. The historic structure is two stories with approximately 940 square feet per floor. The first floor is to be used as a Visitor Center and the second floor as a Research Center for Towson University.

A Stipulated Sum (Single Prime Contract) Bid will be received for the Work defined in the Contract Documents. This project is subject to State of Maryland prevailing wage requirements (Refer to Bid Form). The project is to be substantially complete within 180 calendar days of the Notice To Proceed. Liquidated damages of \$100 per day shall be assessed by the Owner against the Contractor for each calendar day after the date required for substantial completion in the Contract.

The Town of Port Deposit will receive sealed bids until **2:00pm Eastern Standard Time on January 20, 2015** at the Port Deposit Town Hall (64 South Main Street, Port Deposit, MD 21904 Attn: Vicky Rinkerman, Town Administrator). Bids received after this time will not be accepted. Bids will be opened publicly and read aloud immediately after specified closing time. All interested parties are invited to attend. Sealed Bids may be mailed, but must arrive by Bid deadline. Electronically submitted Bids will not be accepted.

Bid Documents will be made available electronically at www.portdeposit.org and on eMaryland Marketplace at www.emarylandmarketplace.com. Hard copies will be available by request for a nonrefundable fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per set. All Bids shall be accompanied by a Bid Bond or Certified Check (made payable to the Town of Port Deposit) in the amount of 5% of the Bid amount. Questions or concerns raised at the pre-Bid Conference will be addressed by addendum, if, in the opinion of the Architect, revision or clarification of the Documents is necessary. Bids shall be based upon the Contract Documents, including any addenda issued, and not upon discussion at the Pre-Bid Conference. All interested parties shall have access to the site. measures; continuing the Narcan program which has saved more than 40 people from dying of drug overdoses; encouraging peer advocates to work in the hospital; working with addicted individuals in the jail system and making sure they continue treatment, such as Vivitrol, when they are released; and continuing with educational programs in the schools, community college and neighborhoods.

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
