State Bill Would Raise Sheriff's Salary

Cecil County Sheriff Scott Adams visited the Cecil County Council this week to discuss proposed state legislation affecting law enforcement.

Sheriff Adams was also asked to discuss a state bill that would increase the salary of the Cecil County Sheriff - and said he wished County Executive Tari Moore had joined him in this discussion.

The issue of the pay for the county office of Sheriff was discussed by former Sheriff Barry Janney in 2014 who told county officials the Cecil County Sheriff is paid at a lower rate than other Sheriffs in the state, especially since not all counties have their Sheriff handling both their law enforcement and court duties plus the management of a detention center.

The Sheriff in office cannot benefit from a salary increase during their term, so Janney's efforts to increase the Sheriff salary have benefitted Sheriff Adams with

his salary set to increase gradually through the mid-\$70,000.

But even with the increases, Adams noted that the Cecil County Sheriff still makes a lot less money than most other Sheriffs in the state with only the Somerset County Sheriff making less money. In Queen Anne's County, which has no jail and a population half of Cecil County's, the Sheriff makes \$132,000 a year.

If the bill is passed, Adams salary would not be increased during this term in office.

The Council discussed the issue with Councilman George Patchell saying Adams is "grossly underpaid."

It was noted that Adams actually had to take a pay cut to become the boss of the law enforcement agency.

But Council members questioned the prudence of tying the Sheriff's salary to the salary of the County Executive, saying these are not comparable positions.
