Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Cecil County, the newest CASA program to start in Maryland will be hosting an open house on Thursday, April 7th from 4:30-7:30 pm, and invites community members to visit their new office space located at the Historical Society of Cecil County (135 East Main Street, Elkton, MD 21921).

CASA of Cecil County is one of 15 programs serving 21 counties throughout the state that provides advocates for abused and neglected children.

"We are so excited to unveil our organization's brand new office space," said Giulia Hodge, the organization's Executive Director.

A CASA volunteer is a court appointed, trained, and committed adult who will represent and advocate for a child's best interest in the child protection system. The primary responsibility is to serve as the "eyes and ears" of the court, getting to know the child while gathering information from the child's family, foster parents, teachers, counselors, etc. and making recommendations to help the judge decide what is best for the child.
