event," FHI Executive Director Carla Geiersbach said.

This year's FHI will include some new activities.

"We have added a craft beer tent this year," Geiersbach said. There will be 20 craft beers to sample in a large tent that will have a great view of the cross country route.

FHI will also include an Outdoor Sports Expo with a variety of vendors that will showcase clothing and equipment for a variety of sports, including activities other than equestrian that are enjoyed at the Fair Hill site such as running wear and bike wear from W. L. Gore & Associates.

Both the Outdoor Sports Expo and craft beer event will be held on Saturday.

The third new attraction at Fair Hill is the availability of business tailgates and other special business-related options.

For the past three years, the event has included space for individual tailgates. Now, businesses can get a location for any sized event.

"We want the businesses to know about us," Geiersbach said, explaining it is a great place to take top clients, top sales people or as a company-wide outing.

The company that makes the collectable Breyer Horses is bringing 200 of their top collectors to Fair Hill International. They will have a special luncheon in the big tent and then get a VIP tour of the cross country course.

FHI has activities for children and a variety of vendors. The equestrian activities include young horse events that begin on Thursday, October 13, followed by events for the major competitions. and young horse events and dressage continues FHI on Friday, October 14. Saturday, October 15, is cross-country day where horses and riders will navigate a 4.5 mile course at 25 miles an hour with more than 30 elaborate jumps. Sunday, October 16, is the stadium jumping day.

compiling a book of photos taken of the funeral train. The professor is searching for pictures and during October he is in the United States.

Several professional photographers were on the run and Paul Fusco, covering the funeral for Look Magazine, captured the slow, painful journey. Rein, however, is searching for personal snapshots of the funeral train and the mourners standing trackside. "The photographs taken that day have become part of our fragmented past and lost to family albums and attics, and I want to collect them and display them in a book as a line of consciousness," he remarked.

In Cecil County plenty of people were standing along the right-of-way with their Brownies or Polaroids. In Elkton Milford Sprecher had his camera and took a few snapshots. Annie Ingram was another photographer, and Larry Beers was taking home movies.

Rein added that he would love to get in touch with more bystanders or their relatives, who stood along the line and took pictures that day.
