dump trucks."

Some jurisdictions use a brine solution that is applied to the roadways prior to a snow or ice event. The mix of salt and liquid shows up on the roadway as thin white lines.

"We are limited to the use of brine solution and will use it on various main/primary roadways and roads with more serious changes in horizontal and vertical curves/grades," Webber said. "Brine has weather limitations and therefore is not used before every storm event."

As for what people can do to help the professionals trying to clear the storms before, during and after the snow and ice events, Webber has one piece of advice.

"Hopefully the public will stay off the roads so that we can perform our snow removal operations," Webber said.
