**PUBLIC NOTICE
TOWN OF PORT DEPOSIT
CHARTER AMENDMENT RESOLUTIONS**

On February 21, 2017, the Mayor and Council of Port Deposit adopted five Charter Amendment Resolutions as follows:

Resolution 06-2017. This resolution amends Article VI, Section 601 Voters (a) Qualified voters to define the qualifications of voters as follows: insert "Only persons, qualified under the Maryland Constitution, duly passed laws and regulations of the State of Maryland, the voting regulations of Cecil County, Maryland, and residing within the incorporated limits of the Town of Port Deposit shall be registered as qualified voters."; and eliminate the qualifications of voters outlined in (b), 1 through 5 and (c), 1 & 2 and move (c) 3. to (b);

Resolution 07-2017. This resolution amends Article VI, Section 606 Registration A. to eliminate the word registered and insert the word registration; and B. to insert that no person shall be entitled to vote in Town elections unless they are registered with the Cecil County Board of Elections;

Resolution 08-2017. This resolution amends Article VII, Section 719 Authorization to Borrow Money to insert the revised reference to state law as follows: The Local Government Article, Title 19, Public Debt, Subtitle 3;

Resolution 09-2017. This resolution amends Article VII, Section 722 Purchasing and Contract 503 as follows: a. to insert the Council shall have the power to create rules and regulations regarding purchasing policy and procedures; b. to increase the amount required to \$25,000 to advertise for sealed bids and to utilize competitive bids and written contracts for all expenditures; and c. to insert all expenditures that exceed \$5,000, but do not exceed \$25,000 shall be approved by the Council utilizing a minimum of 2 quotes from a licensed and qualified contractor or company; and

Resolution 10-2017. This resolution amends Article VIII, Section 801 Town Clerk to insert that the Mayor with the approval of the Council may appoint a Town Clerk.

These amendments shall become effective and part of the Town's Charter on April 13, 2017 unless a petition to have any one or more of such amendments submitted for referendum vote signed by 20% of the qualified voter of the town is presented to the Council on or before this date. Joseph M. Crawford

Joseph M. Crawford, 69 of North East, MD, passed away Monday, March 6, 2017 in the Heartland Hospice House, Wilmington, DE.

Born in Stanton, VA, on February 13, 1948, he was the son of the late Earl H. and the late Nora Crawford.

Mr. Crawford worked as a floor covering installer for his son at Pro Flooring, North East, MD.

Survivors include 6 children: by three daughters: Vicky Crawford of FL, Tammy Crawford of TX, Michael Crawford of North East, MD, Jolene Crawford of VA, Joseph Crawford, Jr. and Alvin Crawford both of North East, MD; a sister: Sharon Webb of Frederica, DE; 14 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

But for several of these people, troubling matters would have a dramatic impact on their lives. About the time they graduated, war was spreading across Europe, and in 1917 the United States entered the conflict, fighting alongside European Allies. Of course, with the casualty rate growing nurses were needed to staff battlefield hospitals in France. Some from Union Hospital responded, caring for fallen soldiers on distant fronts.

One was Miss Campbell. In 1918, the superintendent resigned, enlisting as a nurse in Canada's Military Hospital Service. The year before, she received word that her brother, who was a member of the Canadian Troops, was killed in a battle and a second brother had a leg amputated. Alice Denver also answered the call. She had taken a position at the Rockefeller Institute in New York after graduating. But in 1918 Miss Denver volunteered for war duty in France, nursing wounded and sick soldiers. She returned safely home in May 1919.

Stella Graves' life took a different path. She married Dr. Victor L. Glover in 1914 and they resided in Inwood W. VA., where the physician practiced medicine. She died on Nov. 14, 1917, of tuberculosis, a disease she contracted while assisting the physician. The 1918 annual report of Union Hospital noted that two graduates had died "of disease contracted in their professional work." Research hasn't identified the other person yet.

With the passing decades, the memory of field hospitals, trench warfare, mustard gas, and rumbling artillery on the French Countryside, as well as dangerous epidemics, grew a little dimmer, although the world had changed in startling ways. Surely, the remaining two members of the class of 1914 never forgot their colleagues and friends. As young ladies growing into adulthood in a gentler time, they collectively faced the challenges of becoming degreed nurses in a newly emerging profession, but they also confronted grave, new risks. Some of them gave their lives in the service of others.
