**Parker Is On Governor's "Green Bag" Appointment List**

Each year, the Maryland Governor presents a list of proposed appointments for boards and commissions to the legislature, named the "Green Bag" appointments because of the original satchel that was used to carry the appointment list. This list needs the state Senate's confirmation. This year, Governor Larry Hogan presented 160 appointments to more than 70 boards and commissions. Only one person on the list is from Cecil County. Steven C. Parker is recommended for the Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays.

**Maryland Hunters Bag 86,542 Deer**

The combined archery, firearms and muzzleloader deer hunting seasons in Maryland ran from September 8, 2017 through January 31, 2018. A total of 86,542 deer were killed, 1,000 more than the previous year. Sunday hunters killed 7,204 deer.

The statewide deer harvest included 30,247 antlered and 53,135 antlerless white-tailed deer and 1,423 antlered and 1,737 antlerless sika deer. In Cecil County, 3,703 deer were killed during the recent season, up ten percent over the previous hunting season. The most deer were killed in Frederick County - 7,354. Carroll County hunters harvested 5,896; Baltimore County - 5,559, Garrett - 5,349; and Montgomery - 4,783.

to serving the Cecil College community. We believe the kind of experiential learning this branch will provide will help prepare the next generation of adults for a lifetime of success," said APGFCU President and CEO, Don W. Lewis.

This announcement comes on the heels of APGFCU's \$50,000 donation to the Cecil College Foundation to fund two new programs, which will enhance the educational opportunities for Cecil County and Harford County residents. The first gift of \$25,000 will go toward the creation of an APGFCU Scholarship endowment fund.

The second gift of \$25,000 will provide financial support for Cecil College's First-Year Experience Program. The First-Year Experience Program introduces students to the processes of self-evaluation and self-improvement, with a portion of the course instruction dedicated to financial literacy as one of the four habits for academic success.

"I want to give you a few facts from a recent survey. Forty-two percent of adults gave themselves the grades C, D, or F with regard to their own personal finances. Twenty-six percent have not saved anything for retirement. Thirty-two percent have no savings. Sixty-two percent don't have a budget and 25 percent don't pay their bills on time. That is the lack of financial literacy," said Cecil College Trustee, Mark Mortenson. "I am proud to say this college introduced a course in the fall where the central components were financial education. Our own students who had recently been taught in the state of Maryland said, 'we were surprised by what we didn't know.'"

Also on hand for this landmark event were Cecil County Executive, Alan McCarthy; APGFCU Board of Directors Chairman, Barry Decker; and APGFCU Board members Charles Alston, and John Blomquist; Cecil College's Board of Trustees Chairwoman Sarah W. Colenda; and Board member Kathy Kunda.

In addition to the APGFCU branch, the credit union will provide students with financial education resources such as financial literacy workshops on campus and online money management tools. The branch will have two full-time and two part-time employees, and Cecil College students will have the opportunity to fill these positions.

This will be a full-service branch offering the same products and all the same services available at any APGFCU branch. The branch will also be available to members of the community who visit the campus for various activities, sporting events, enrichment, and summer programs.

APGFCU is working closely with Cecil College to identify the peak hours when students are on campus. Current plans are for the branch to be open from mid-morning through early evening, Monday to Thursday, and mid-morning through early afternoon on Friday. Branch hours will be reviewed and may be adjusted to best serve the campus community.
