Richard Hamilton Ward

Richard Hamilton Ward, known to all as Kip, died after a short hospital stay, on Friday, February 16, 2018 at Union Hospital in Elkton, Maryland, with his wife, Donna by his side.

He was born on March 13, 1948 in Woodbury New Jersey to Herbert Hamilton Ward and Kathryn Summerill Ward, and was the second of five children. With his father serving in the Navy, Kip and his family traveled both in the states and abroad.

Kip attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill on a soccer scholarship and received a degree in "Creative Writing, Religion and Art," created especially for him. After graduation, Kip worked in the Athletic Department at UNC, promoting the non-revenue sports at Carolina – Kip was a Tar Heel through and through.

Kip co-founded in 1972, along with Victoria Brawley, Rainbow Soccer a recreational soccer league that is still in operation today. The friendship and bonds formed at Rainbow endure.

In Kip's Rainbow world, you didn't keep score, everyone was a winner and what was important was being in the game. In the seventies, Kip directed the Rainbow Soccer Camp, an instructional summer camp in which college athletes and experienced players taught "the

beautiful game" to youth.

Kip spent many years in London, England but finally decided to settle down in Elkton, Maryland with his wife, Donna Tamayo-Ward. Along with Donna, Kip is survived by his daughters: Alessandra Starr Ward, Katy Tamayo, Beth Tamayo, son in law TJ Sanders and grandchildren: Zachary Tamayo, Jayden Sanders and Riley Sanders as well as his brothers Herbert Henry Ward IV and Joseph Summerill Ward. Kip's family and friends span the globe.

Throughout his life Kip was engaged passionately in community organizations and enterprises including the Rotary Club, Elk River Yacht Club in Maryland, the Loom Press in Chapel Hill and Order of the Golden Fleece, the oldest and highest honorary society at UNC. He had an innate genius for promotion, for Rainbow Soccer and UNC sports teams, as a successful campaign manager for a candidate for Cecil County Circuit Judge, and most recently as co-owner and caregiver for T-Ward Homecare. His love and caring spirit spread throughout everything and everyone he touched

County-Wide Trash Bash 2018 Scheduled For April 22nd

In an effort to maintain the beauty of where we live, work and play, and do our part to minimize pollution, Cecil County Executive Alan McCarthy and Council President Joyce Bowsbey invite the community to participate in a county-wide TRASH BASH 2018 on April 22nd - to coincide with Earth Day, the worldwide celebration designated to preserve and protect the environment.

We would like to encourage local businesses, neighborhoods, and organizations to join in on picking up and properly disposing of trash in and around Cecil County. This event is really about cleaning up our yards and surrounding sub-divisions and areas. We would like families and friends to work together to simply take a few minutes out of their day to improve their immediate surroundings.

Trash Bash 2018 not only reinforces the need to properly dispose of trash, but encourages the use of alternatives to plastic, including items like paper bags, reusable grocery bags, glass or metal containers and more. Roughly 8 million metric tons of plastic ends up in our oceans every year -- every little bit of a reduction in use is helpful.

This year's Trash Bash isn't our only "green Cecil" event that's going on in the county. Our Roads Division promotes the year-round Adopt-A-Road program where organizations can register and sign a contract to pick up trash on their designated road four (4) times per year. The Roads Division provides safety vests and warning signs and will also install an Adopt-A-Road sign pursuant to the conditions on the contract. The Cecil County Solid Waste Management Division will be open on Sunday, April 22nd from 7:30 AM to 3 PM for Household Hazardous Waste Day. While regular household waste, including any items that may be collected during Trash Bash, will NOT be accepted during this annual event, you can bring items such as oil based stains, gasoline, pool chemicals, vegetable oil, and antifreeze to the Central Landfill, located at 758 E.
