This contract is for a project to construct approximately 540 LF of 8" and 2,620 LF of 12" gravity sewer piping with all appurtenances as shown on the Contract Drawings and described in the Specifications. The work here in includes but is not limited to installation of sewer, manhole (s) sanitary house connections up to the right of way line, a jack and bore across Route 40 of a 24" steel sleeve and paving restoration and maintenance of traffic. OBITUARIES

Donald Carl Herring

Donald Carl Herring, 87, of Hurlock, Md., died Saturday, May 12, 2018 at The Charlotte Hall Veterans Home in Charlotte Hall, Md.

Mr. Herring was born in Covington, Ky. on February 20, 1931 to Carl and Helen (Jones) Hering, and reared in Indiana. Donald graduated high school in Kentland, Ind. and it is there that he would meet Shirley Eileen Robey from Earl Park, Ind., whom he wed on January 28, 1951. Donald attended Butler University in Indianapolis, Ind. where he earned a degree in Journalism in 1952. Following college, Donald began a professional career with The Journal Gazette in Ft. Wayne, Ind. which was interrupted when he was called to duty with the U.S. Army. He served as the Chief of the public information section with the 7th Infantry Division in Korea, and upon his discharge at the rank of SFC, resumed his civilian newspaper career in Ft. Wayne. In 1957, he began work at the Indianapolis Star as a police beat reporter. He worked his way up through the ranks to become a member of the editorial staff and was the editor of the Sunday Star magazine. In addition to his duties at the Star, Donald also did freelance editorial work and taught Journalism at Marian College in Indianapolis, Ind. In 1971 he was hired to become the Editor of The Cecil Whig in Elkton, Md., and remained with Chesapeake Publishing, the Whig's parent company, until 1997. At the time of his retirement, Donald was the Executive Editor for Chesapeake Publishing which operated numerous newspapers and publications throughout the Delmarva area. After retiring from Chesapeake Publishing, Donald continued to write and for many years his editorials and anecdotal stories appeared in both The Cecil Whig and The Star Democrat on a regular basis. He had a strong belief in the need for education and literacy and taught as a substitute teacher in Cecil County.

He was involved in programs to teach reading to both adults and children through the Cecil County Public Library and was an active supporter of the Cecil County Historical Society.

Throughout his college, military, and professional career, Donald was the recipient of numerous awards and citations, serving in leadership roles and as an officer in several academic and professional organizations. Donald was a staunch supporter of military and emergency services organizations. He was a Master Mason and was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and the American Legion. Donald was a life member of the Singler Fire Department in Elkton, where he served as an administrative member, and a member of the Cecil County Emergency Management staff.

Survivors include his three sons, Martin C. Herring (Mary Frances) of Mechanicsville, Md., David C. Herring (Karen) of Hurlock, Md., and John F. Herring of Wilmington, Del.; numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren; his sister, Patti Keaffaber of Connersville, Ind.; and his sister-in-law, Wanda Helderbran of Earl Park, Ind. He is preceded in death by his wife, Shirley Robey Herring; and his son, Stephen A. Herring.

A memorial service and inurnment with military honors in Gilpin Manor Memorial Park, Elkton, will be private.
